Our **FS2** children are settling nicely into a daily routine, developing their independence and making new friends. They have been showcasing their amazing ability at making models from construction bricks and enjoyed a Diwali Dance Workshop presented by Deda earlier this week.

Y1 took a walk in the local area to study the different type of buildings around them; they then came back to school to build their own junk buildings out of recycled materials. Miss Gamble's class has also been delving into the arts this half term at Kedleston Training Centre (Miss Balfour's class are due to visit in November).

Y2 have had a fantastic time re-enacting The Battle of Swarkestone Bridge. The Redcoat army beat the Jacobites again! They have also been conducting their own investigations about germs, as part of their Florence Nightingale topic. Can you guess how quickly their glitter germs spread?

Parentmail PMX

For the first time, this year we introduced our new Parent Evening Manager. This has proved a huge success with over 50% of parents having booked their slot within 40 minutes of the system going live. No more pieces of paper going missing in bookbags and a choice of times available to suit parents/carers' busy schedules.

By registering with ParentMail PMX, you can now also access the online shop system to pay for school trips and activities, dinners and adult Come to Lunch meals.

When logging in to pay for a school trip or activity, always click payments, and if you cannot find the item you are looking for, click **Shop** at the top of the page. This will take you to a full list of items (including those you have already paid for). The reason the activity can only be found here is because the payment due date has passed.

You may also be interested in downloading the free ParentMail app. This app will negate the need for you to sift through your inbox looking for school messages, as they are all easily accessed from one place and you will receive a notification when anything new comes in. If you decide to not download this app, we ask that you check you email inbox once per week so that you don't miss any messages.

Should you have any problems navigating this system, please speak to the School Office. We are always on hand to help.
