Highlights from this Half Term

With only 4 weeks in this half term, we have certainly packed it all in! With cake sales, World Book Day, Sport Relief, Music Celebration Assembly and an Easter Bonnet Parade, this half term has certainly been an eventful one.

FS2 have been taking part in number hunts this half term whilst enjoying the outdoor space. This morning, they showcased their wonderful creations, along with KS1, in the Easter Bonnet Parade—we hope you enjoyed it.

Y1's topic this term is 'Where in the World?' The children have been getting creative making some African masterpieces. Continuing with this theme, the children welcomed Wildlife Workshop into school earlier this week where they got up close and personal with some unusual creatures and critters.

Y2 continued with the WW2 topic that they started last half-term. A trip to Holdenby House gave the children an experience of what life was like on the Home Front as an evacuee. The finale to this topic was definitely the 'VE-Day Party' where parents were invited to come along and join in the fun of WW2 celebrations.

In **Y3** the Viking theme continued with a visit from Partake Theatre which included role play activities as well as loom weaving and battle re-enactments. During PE lessons, the children have been learning the importance of setting up the apparatus correctly before using the equipment.

Y4 got off to a 'rocky' start! As part of their Science lessons, the children have been learning about the permeability and durability of different types of rocks. This half term, they have also enjoyed creating their own mythological creatures in art!

Y5 have been creating their own 'Pop Art' masterpieces—we have some talented artists here at Markeaton! An impromptu visit to Derby University's Sports Hall allowed the children to improve upon their ball skills and coordination.

Y6, along with Y5, participated in a trip to Kedleston Hall earlier in the term, which gave the children the opportunity to explore a stately home and learn about its history. Whilst in Science lessons, Y6's have started experiments to see which items rust.

Thank you to all the parents/carers who made their voluntary contributions for these trips and activities. Also, a very big thank you to Markeaton PTFA who subsidise these trips by £10 per child per year. Android users, you may have experienced problems when using the PMX app, particularly when trying to view your parent evening slot. We have been advised by ParentMail that a new, improved version of the app is now available that should overcome previous glitches that came up when using the ParentMail app on Android. Please download the new version by going to the Google Play Store and searching for 'ParentMail'; on the bottom of their app's page click 'I'm In'. The Beta version of the app will then be available to install.
