As a school we continue to grow and evolve and we are always looking at different ways in which we can improve (but not losing sight of what we do really well). The questionnaire responses have been incredibly positive and although the exact analysis is scheduled for September, plus the annual Parent/Carer Forum, early indications suggest you agree or strongly agree that your child is happy, there is a positive atmosphere in school, you feel welcome when you come to school and you are pleased with the outdoor environment. There are, of course, questionnaire responses which point towards some changes that we do need to make but I just wanted to say thank you for taking the time to complete them. This feedback, alongside other conversations we have had with parents/carers throughout the course of the year really help us make those improvements and build on our strengths.

In terms of how we assess and what your child is learning, this is something we will look at again in the Autumn Term as some of you are still unsure about some of the details surrounding these areas. We have worked hard with this over the last few years but, based on what is coming back, we might need to fine tune this again. How we assess your child and how we map out the curriculum is very secure within the school and is applied consistently but maybe it needs to be communicated in a clearer way to parents/carers. We do have information on our website but perhaps a face to face presentation might work better. We have already had a few ideas so we will keep you posted.

When we come back in September we will also be sharing our latest set of results (FS2, Y1, Y2 and Y6) and our new School Development Targets – plus an update on how we did with this year's targets. It's a bit early yet but keep your eyes peeled for the date of the Parent/Carer Forum in the hall as we will cover it all in that meeting. 

This half term **FS2**'s topic 'Around the World' introduced the children to some unusual animals that they were then able to get up closer to during their trip to Twycross Zoo.

Y1 have been expressing their inner 'Van Gogh' with acrylic painting this term. They have also enjoyed computing coding as well as enjoying a trip to Stratford Butterfly Farm which gave them a hands-on experience.

Y2's topic this term was 'Explorers'. A visit to Yorkshire Wildlife Park allowed the children to observe a variety of animals from different countries, discover all about desert, polar, savannah and rainforest habitats, and also have the opportunity to handle live animals from these regions.

Y3 have immersed themselves in their Mayan topic and discovered the origins of chocolate. The finale to this topic... or the chocolate topping on the cake... was an exciting trip to Cadbury World!

Y4 put their persuasive writing skills to the test by producing their own Mayan Myths. They also produced their own chocolate bar wrappers and enjoyed a trip to Cadbury World.

Y5 have been creating graffiti art on the school walls, in the style of Keith Haring, and have enjoyed creating Japanese Haiga inspired poems this half term. They have also learned about our coastlines with a hands-on exercise using clay to create their own coastlines to understand the process of creating undercutting, caves, arches, stacks and stumps.

This term could not have been any busier for our **Y6** pupils. They've visited their new secondary schools, participated in Careers Day, raised money during Enterprise Week for charity YWAMBlantyre.com, enjoyed their Leavers' Meal at Frankie and Benny's and spent a fantastic two nights at PGL.


