#### Parentmail - Have you connected yet?

To all new parents, you should by now be receiving our correspondence via Parentmail. But, did you know that this system also allows you to easily pay for trips, give consent, book Parent Evening appointments, as well as paying for School Dinners (Y3 - Y6 only). If you have not yet connected, it is a simple process. Please contact the School Office for your registration email.

#### \*\*\*\*\*\*

When logging in to pay for a school trip or activity, always click Payments, and if you cannot find the item you are looking for, click Shop at the top of the page. This will take you to a full list of items (including those you have already paid for). The reason the activity can only be found here is because the payment due date has passed.

#### **Problems receiving Parentmail emails?**

We have recently been made aware of a problem whereby some parents are no longer receiving Parentmail emails in their normal email inbox; they have to log into Parentmail to view. We have raised this with Parentmail and this is their response:

We are aware of an issue with Outlook and Hotmail inboxes incorrectly classifying our emails as malicious or We have made contact with the provider phishing. directly to rectify this false message and are treating it as a high priority. An update will follow once we have been able to resolve the problem.

Please try this guide on whitelisting the email address for ParentMail (info@parentmail.co.uk) and see if this resolves the matter. It should force the emails into the inbox rather than an alternative folder.

# On Halloween & Bonfire Night Keep Safe Think of Others HAVE FUN!

## DO'S

- Remember road safety and wear bright clothing while 'trick or treating'
- Keep Halloween 'tricks' safe
- Be considerate to others
- Follow Derbyshire Fire & Rescue safety tips on the reverse of this leaflet Go to an organised fireworks display
- it's the safest way to enjoy them

## DON'T

- Go 'trick or treating' alone and take an adult with you
- Cause damage to people's homes or prop
- Handle fireworks if you're under 18
- Knock on stranger's doors
- Scare or hurt other
- Let off fireworks between 11pm and 7am o

#### CALL 101 In an emergency always dial 999 www.derbyshire.police.uk





- Keep fireworks in a closed metal box and take them out one at a time
- Follow the manufacturers instructions on each firework. Read them by torch light, not a naked flame, always buy fireworks from a reputable source.
- Light fireworks at arms length using a safety firework lighter or fuse wick - then stand back.
- Never go back to a firework
   once lit, it may still go off.
- Collect used fireworks with care, douse with water and bury them or place in a metal container.
- Keep children away from fireworks and bonfires.

- Keep pets indoors.
- Take care with sparklers young children should <u>not handle these.
  </u>
- · NEVER throw fireworks.
- NEVER keep fireworks in your pocket.
- Keep a bucket of water handy.

## If you must light a bonfire, follow these safety tips:

- Site the bonfire well away from houses, garages, sheds, fences, overhead cables, trees, shrubs and well away from your fireworks.
- Before lighting, make sure there are no animals hiding inside.
- Be careful when building the bonfire so it does not collapse once lit.

- Don't burn foam filled furniture, aerosols, tins of paint, or bottles.
- Never use flammable liquids such as paraffin or petrol to light the fire.
- Keep children and pets away from the fire.
- In case of emergency, keep buckets of water, a garden hose or fire extinguisher ready.
- When the party is over, pour water on the embers before leaving.
