Highlights from this Half Term

A great start to 2019! The children, as always, are enthusiastic to learn. Here is just a small selection of what we have been doing this half term:

FS2 got off to a wintery start by putting the correct number of buttons on their snowmen and learning a funny poem about snow. As part of our penpal handwriting scheme the children start the day with some fun gross motor and fine motor warm-ups.

Y1 have been looking at Chinese patterns as we celebrate 'The Year of the Pig'. They have also mastered the art of making their own pots by coiling clay - hard work but some amazing results! 'Amazing Me' has taught the children how to identify human body parts and lessons in 'our senses' lead to some funny faces when exploring our sense of smell!

Y2's half term activities have been focussed around World War II. The children have built their own Anderson shelters and gardens, made pop-poms, sampled 'rations' and planted some carrot seeds as they 'Dig For Victory'. Thank you to all the parents who responded to the evacuee letters the children penned.

Y3 have been busy this half term classifying animals using computer programme 'Popplet'. They also enjoyed a visit to Derby Museum to view real life Egyptian mummies which helped bring their classroom learning of Ancient Egypt to life.

Y4 's topic this term is also 'Ancient Egypt'; the children immersed themselves into the role of detectives as they uncovered the mystery of the tomb raiders. Exploring the work of artist, Leonid Afremov, produced some fabulous masterpieces as the children created their own reflection art pieces of the River Nile.

Y5 have looked at the stigma surrounding mental health and explored artists who embrace their mental health and emotions in order to create wonderful art. The children created their own masterpieces inspired by artists, Kandinsky and Jean Michael Basquiat. Ever mindful of our environment, Year 5 have also been investigating how many products they could find that contain palm oil.

The new year kicked off for **Y6** with a Murder Mystery; the children investigated the scene of the crime to infer what could have happened, putting their reasoning skills to the test! Also this half term, Y6 have been germinating their own cress in order to understand the conditions required to make cress grow successfully. And finally, as well as keeping our minds stimulated, we also participated in RAMMIE's Skipping Programme to keep our bodies active too!
