- "Growth mindset is fab. My daughter is already asking about senior school and what it is like. I hope that the zest for learning she has been given at Markeaton will stand her in good stead."
- "By keeping her love of learning ignited, even during SATS year."
- "I think the curriculum is broad but could include more outdoor learning and not just when the sun is shining."
- "If we knew in advance what the topics to be covered were then maybe we would support more; this term I don't think we received the termly topic letter until week 3. If we had it earlier, we would be able to support the children and maybe offer relevant services to the school."

In other news, our environment theme continued in Reception today with all the children dressing up to celebrate World Ocean's Day.
