### **Parent/Carer Update 19.6.2020**

To all Parents/Carers,

Hope you are all ok. At first when it started to rain I was grateful but now, after day three of torrential downpours, the sun and warm weather can come back asap! Next week looks more favourable which is good.

### ***Quite a bit to get through with this update...***

As we know, Y2, Y3, Y4 and Y5 will not be back in school till September. However, and we are very aware of this, with each day that passes, some children and families are becoming more disconnected from school. With this in mind, we have come up with a few ideas to help with this (some of which were spoken about in last week's update):

1. Last week I mentioned that we were looking into Remote Learning and how we could facilitate some kind of online Class 'Catch Up'. We have moved at quite a pace with this and we are likely to use [Microsoft Teams](#). Staff are scheduled to receive training very soon and our IT Support Technician is already working hard to get all parents/carers set up. The first stage is for us, as a school domain, to issue you with an email address and a password. Once you have been given this I am hoping it will be quite straightforward to join a meeting and see your teacher/classmates! As I am sure you can appreciate though, we will also be looking into relevant safeguarding protocols too and this needs to be established before anything else...so I will keep you posted.
2. Teaching staff have been asked to record themselves reading a story for their class. Once completed, this will create a virtual school library which can be accessed on the website (using Vimeo like we did with the school video). I will select a few books and record them too – one for each key stage. Hopefully these will be available by the end of next week.
3. If agreed by the Governors and the Local Authority, I am going to invite all year groups that are not currently in school to a class picnic + socially distanced games event on the field before the end of this term. They obviously won't be coming in at the same time and it will only be held outside – with our site manager currently looking into marquees if it pours it down! **We would ask children to bring a packed lunch as well.**

An example schedule could be: Monday 10am – 12pm Y2 (Miss Gamble's class) will come in and be split into three groups of ten. Monday 1pm – 3pm Y2 (Mrs Smith's class) will come in and do the same. Y3 would be Tuesday, Y4 on Thursday and Y5 on Friday. Nothing is confirmed yet but I am hoping we can make it happen and I am hoping for warm sunny days too!
