Class Picnics and Key Worker/Vulnerable Children Group

Having thought about this throughout the week, and the importance of transition at this time, your child's class picnic will now be for the whole day (10:00am – 3:00pm, with lunch in the middle). The first half of the morning will be spent playing games, getting reacquainted with friends/teachers and the afternoon will be an opportunity for your child to spend some proper time with their teacher next year. All of it will still happen outside and there will be a gazebo (six in total) for each of the bubbles to make it feel more like a classroom (and in case it rains!).

In order to staff this accordingly it does mean that the Key Worker/Vulnerable children group will have to end on Friday 17th July so that we have more adults to supervise the picnics. On the flip side though, any child who is currently in the Key Worker/Vulnerable Children group will be able to take part in the picnics without having to be segregated in their own bubble/separate area of the field. It also worth remembering that if your child is in the Key Worker/Vulnerable Children group and in an eligible year group (FS2, Y1 and Y6) then they can come in for two days in the classroom during that last week.
