

Care Curiosity Determination

Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

We hope you and your family had a lovely break and are settling into the new Spring term. This letter is to inform both children and parents about the topics that we will be looking at this term and give general information that might be useful.

As you know the children spend a lot of time outside in all weathers and so it's important to have suitable clothing e.g. a warm coat, hat, gloves and scarf.

Please make sure these are labelled clearly as they often fall off coat pegs and out of pockets! Please ensure that all other school uniform is also clearly labelled. If this is in pen, check regularly as it does come off in the wash!



Your child will continue to have PE on a Wednesday and will need to come to school dressed in their PE kit on that day. Your child will need black pumps/trainers with Velcro (no laces please!), black shorts or joggers for colder days, a round neck t-shirt and hoodie in your child's house colour. If your child wears earrings, please ensure that these are the stud type, remove them before school or provide tape for your child to put on their ears themselves.

Children DO NOT need to bring in a water bottle to school, as we have provided each child with their own named water bottle that will remain in school. However, if your child has a packed lunch, they DO NEED to bring a drink for lunchtime.

It is important that children read their Phonics based texts at home at least three times a week, to help develop fluency and improving prosody skills. They need to continue practising their phonics booklets and enjoying discussing their sharing books with an adult. The attached document may help you with comments to add to your child's reading record. Children will be familiar with the words on the orange Phase 2 Common Exception Word (CEW) mats (a different format was given out at Pupil Progress Meetings in November), children will now need to learn to spell these when writing. Purple Phase 3 CEW mats will be sent home in bookbags and it's important that your child now begins to learn how to sight read these. Remember, CEWs are tricky because you can't sound them out (decode)!

Please send your child's bookbag to school with them on their reading day only! Please ask a member of the FS2 staff if you are unsure when this is.

We are delighted to see that 98% of children have one or more parent/carer accessing and engaging with their FS2 learning journey on Tapestry! When accessing your account via the internet (not the app) there are useful downloads in the Document section. If you are unsure how to activate your account or access content, please see Miss Sidebottom.


