# 'Grow and Learn Together'

We hope you and your family had a lovely Easter break and are settling unto the new Summer term. This letter is to inform about the topics that we will be looking at this term and give general information that might be useful.





The children spend a lot of time outside in all weathers and so it's important to have suitable clothing and items e.g. a summer hat/cap, sandals on hot days (your child MUST wear socks with their sandals) and sun cream. Please make sure these are labelled clearly with your child's name! Please ensure that you put sun cream on your child before school and we will ensure that they top this up in the school day as necessary. Children still require their own wellies for outdoor learning and rainy days!

Children DO NOT need to bring in a water bottle to school, as all children have been provided with their own named water bottle. However, if your child has a packed lunch they DO NEED to bring a drink for lunchtime.

Needed: We need lots of empty boxes (**no larger** than a cereal box), shiny sweet paper wrappers and plastic containers (washed, no milk cartons please) for the 'junk' model table.



Your child will have one timetabled P.E. lesson a week, on a Tuesday and should continue to come to school in their PE kits. Children will need to wear black pumps, black shorts and a round neck t-shirt in their house colour LABELLED WITH THEIR NAME. Jewellery is not allowed in P.E. lessons. If your child wears earrings, please ensure that these are the stud type, remove them before school or **provide tape** for your child to put on their ears themselves.
