

## **50 Word Flash Fiction Writing Competition**

Derby Book Festival launched its 50 word Flash Fiction Writing Competition on Monday 30th March. This year's theme is 'Home'. We hope it might be a way to encourage writing - having a limit on words can help the least enthusiastic child and the theme of home is something they're even more familiar with at the moment!

There are three age categories:

- 11 years and under
- 12 17 years
- 18 years and over.

There will be one winner in each category and each will win a £50 book token.

Derby Book Festival's Flash Fiction Competition is for a story of up to 50 words on the subject of 'Home'.

The winning stories will be illustrated and then printed as **a set of bookmarks** to be distributed across Derby and Derbyshire to promote the Festival.

The theme last year was 'Our World'. Here's the winning story from the under 11s category, which was won by Nana from St Joseph's RC Primary School:

Story: Silversweep darted through the water at the tail of her pod. She hadn't eaten but was still optimistic, expertly hunting for prey. In the corner of her eye, she spotted a stray fish. Darting towards it, Silversweep snapped, swallowing the rubbery meat. It tasted wrong. She realised too late; plastic.

The closing date for the competition is Tuesday 2nd June at 10pm (with judging planned to take place in July).

## **DCFC Club Facts**

## About the Stadium

Pride Park Stadium has been Derby County's home ground since 1997 when the club relocated from its former home, The Baseball Ground. As well as Rams' home games, the stadium is used for a range of non -matchday activities including conferences, weddings and other sporting events. In recent years, the stadium has hosted concerts by major international music artists, monster trucks and international friendly football matches and boasts a capacity of 33,597 seats.

### **Key Players**

Wayne Rooney has recently become a crowd favourite for Derby County after transferring from D.C United in America. He has also played for teams such as Everton and Manchester United in his career.

Martin Waghorn joined the Rams back in 2018 after transferring from Ipswich town. He is a key part of the Derby County squad and has also played in Scotland for Rangers.

### **Club History**

Derby County began life in 1884, as an off-shoot of Derbyshire County Cricket Club - formed some 13 years earlier - with football growing more popular. In those days there was no Football League, so the Rams had to make do with a series of friendly matches and the FA Cup.

### **Recent Years**

Former England international midfielder Frank Lampard was appointed as the club's new manager on 31st May 2018 and oversaw a memorable 2018/19 campaign. Derby finished sixth to secure a Play-Off place and also enjoyed a memorable run to the Fourth Round of the Carabao Cup.

Derby reached the Play-Off Final against Aston Villa, but suffered a 2-1 defeat to miss out on a place in the Premier League. Their place at Wembley Stadium was secured following a stunning comeback against Leeds United In the Semi-Finals, overcoming a 1-0 First Leg loss at home to win 4-2 at Elland Road and 4-3 over the two ties. In doing so, they became the first side in Championship Pllay-Off history to turn around a First Leg defeat at home to reach the Final. Lampard departed in July 2019 to return to Chelsea as their Head Coach and was replaced by former Dutch international star Phillip Cocu.

**Dear Parents/Carers** 

We are pleased to let you know that your child can receive a daily phonics lesson whilst schools are closed. Phonics is the way we teach children to recognise the sounds in words. It helps your child to learn to read and is an essential part of your child's education.

During the summer term, you will be able to access for your child a daily phonics lesson by clicking on <u>Letters and Sounds for home and school</u>. All lessons are introduced by celebrities, including children's TV presenters, which adds an exciting addition to the lessons.

There are three sets of daily lessons to choose from and we suggest your child starts with one set of lessons most suitable to their year group **and** reading ability. If you're not sure which lessons your child should watch or your child finds the lessons too difficult, then your school should be able to recommend which lessons are the most appropriate for your child.

From Monday 27 April, a new phonics lesson will be uploaded everyday, Monday to Friday, at the times below during the summer term. \*After upload, each lesson will then be available to watch at any time during the summer term.

11 am*	Learning to blend	For children in Reception and Year 1 who need extra practice sounding and reading words such as 'tap' 'cap' 'mat' 'pat'
10 am*	Reception Summer term	For children who can confidently blend and read words such as 'fish' 'chat' and 'rain'
10:30 am*	Year 1 Summer term	For children who can confidently blend and read words such as 'stamp' 'chair' and 'green'

After watching each lesson, we encourage you to read aloud to your child and, if your child has reading books from school, listen to your child read. More information about phonics and how to help your child can be found in our <u>parent/carer video guide</u>. Further guidance on how you can help your child continue their education at home is available in <u>Help primary school children</u> <u>continue their education</u>.

The online lessons are designed to follow the phonics programme your child has been learning at school and are the only online Letters and Sounds lessons approved and funded by the Department for Education.

As with all online content, parents and carers are advised to supervise their child's use of the internet. Further guidance and support on the use of online materials can be accessed from websites such as <u>ParentInfo</u> and <u>Internetmatters.org</u>
