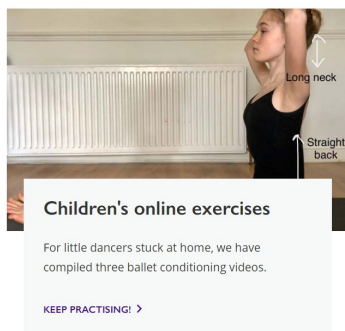
Key Workers

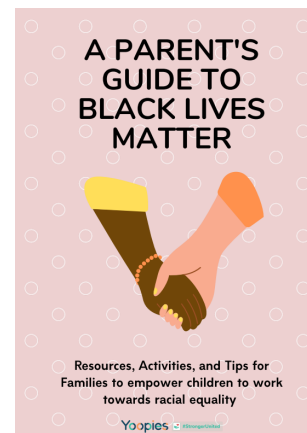
Royal Academy of Dance—RAD@Home
