Make sure the flower is brightly coloured to attract your butterflies.</p>	<p>If you have a garden, go outside and have a look at any flowers or plants that you have. Choose one to sit and draw. If you don't have a garden look online or in a book and copy a plant or flower from the picture.</p>	<p>Colour in your flower or plant that you drew yesterday.
