doing this term!

Our topic work will be related to a question or statement for the classes to investigate. These will include:-

- Can we paint a school landscape?
- How can we write digitally?
- Can I make a model playground?
- Are schools the same everywhere?
- How has school changed?
- Where does our food come from?

In RE we will:

• find out about Judaism and their beliefs.

In D&T we will:

 design, make and evaluate a model playground using simple axles, springs and knots.

As computer users we will:

- · create media through digital writing
- know how we might use technology to communicate with people.
- be able to explain why it is important to be considerate and kind to people online and respect their choices.
- be able to give examples of issues online that might make someone feel sad, worried, uncomfortable or frightened and know how we might get help.

As musicians we will:

- rehearse and perform.
- compose and notate.
- listen and appraise.
- experience different composers' and performers' work.

As historians we will:

- compare classrooms from today and from the Victorian era and the 1970's.
- experience days of school-life through the ages.
- compare school lessons and activities such as the 3R's, school dinners.

As geographers we will:

- locate and name the continents on a world map and use maps, globes etc.
- recognise similarities and differences of geographical features in the immediate environment.
- talk about people and places within the local area.
- compare Derby with a contrasting city in a different country including human and physical features.
- ask and answer geographical questions.
