Trip Volunteer Code of Conduct

Markeaton Primary School highly values parents/carers and others who volunteer to help out with school activities. Many school activities would be at risk if it were not for your help and many of our pupils benefit greatly from it.

All volunteers are expected to maintain high standards of behaviour and conduct when undertaking any activity associated with school.

Volunteers will:

- Observe the high standards of behaviour and ethical conduct mandated by the school.
- Respect other volunteers, members of staff and pupils.
- Adhere to all school policies, including the <u>Safeguarding Policy</u>, <u>Behaviour Policy</u> and <u>Data</u> <u>Protection Policy</u> (These can be found on our school website).
- Treat all pupils and members of staff equally.
- Report any incident of challenging behaviour to the class teacher/trip leader.
- Accept and follow directions from the supervisor and seek guidance through clarification where uncertain of tasks or requirements.

Volunteers will not:

- Discipline pupils; if there are any problems, the class teacher or a senior member of staff will be informed immediately, and they will manage the situation.
- Take photographs during a trip.
- Work with pupils when not in the proper physical or emotional state to do so, e.g. under medication which causes drowsiness, or under extreme stress which may impair judgement.
- Behave in a manner which may bring the school into disrepute when representing the school.
- Take responsibility for first aid for children on the trip or take them to the toilet (unless it is your own child.
