Some children are still very reflective and talking about in class and some children are processing it in their own way. Our new tree, seen in last week's Weekly Word, has taken really well to its new surroundings and the children are invited to visit it whenever they choose and remember the Queen.

Aside from this, school and the curriculum has been busy as always. Top left we have children in Y6 being visited by a team of local Police Officers.
