Some great work has been going on in Y4 this week. They have been learning all about self-care and how to take care of our own mental health. Some great ideas in there!

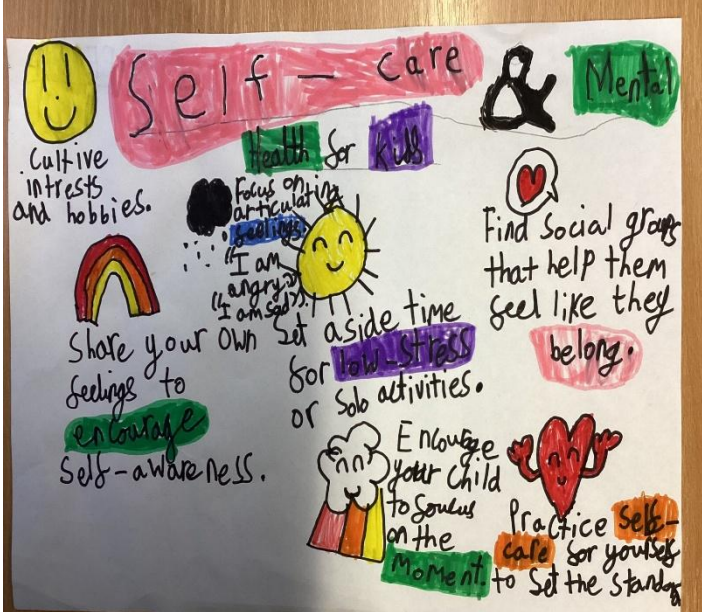
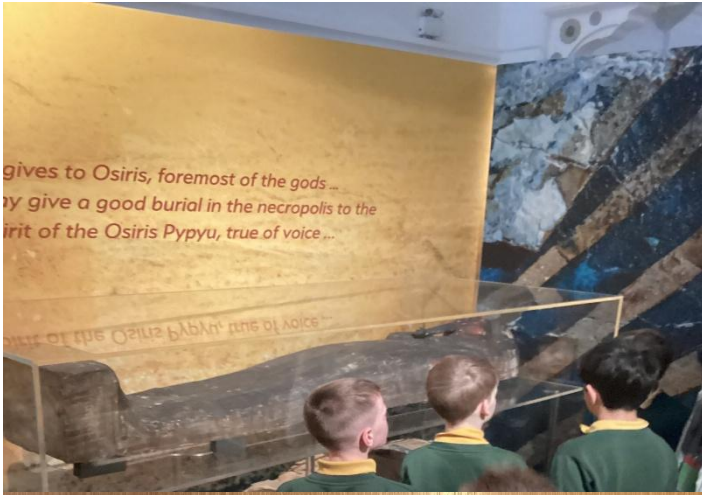
